Motivation Letter (why do you want to study in Germany? What are your career plans for the future?) and CV	
Proof of sufficient financial means (currently 720,00 EUR per month), please provide one of the following: → Blocked account at a German bank* to the minimum amount of 720,00 Euro per month (withdrawal limit, for one year the amount will be 8.640,00 Euro) → Proof of scholarship/ grant from a German/European institution (DAAD, ERASMUS, etc.) ○ Letter by your Estonian university over the agreement that you are doing this exchange)	
Proof of German language skills → Level of at least B1/B2 → Otherwise a confirmation from the university that the lectures will be held in English language and proof of English knowledge

<input type="checkbox"/> Visa fee is currently 75,00 Euro (to pay only in cash)	

Details from your University in Germany:

A) Confirmed university admission letter (“Zulassungsbescheid”)

- Subject and begin of study
- Language of instruction

B) Confirmed language course („Intensiv-Sprachkurs“) with conditional university admission („Bedingter Zulassungsbescheid“)

- Course has to take minimum 18 hours per week over 6 month at a German language school (weekend or evening courses are insufficient)
- Receipt/confirmation of language course payment for minimum 3 month
- Proof of conditional university admission or “uni-assist” or confirmation as an applicant or detailed communication with university for a concrete subject of study
- Proof of German language skills of level A2 according to the European Framework for Languages is mandatory

C) Confirmed admission to a preparatory course for university (“Studienkolleg”)

- Details regarding preparation and intend begin of study
- Proof of conditional university admission or letter of “uni assist” or confirmation of admission as an applicant or detailed communication with the university for a concrete subject of study or entrance examination
- Proof of German language skills of level A2 according to the European Framework for Languages is mandatory

D) Invitation for admission test for preparatory course (Studienkolleg)

- Proof of Germany language skills of level A2/B1 according to the European Framework for Languages is mandatory

E) Admission to an internship

- Letter of the university with details about the internship: it has to be mandatory in order to be admitted to university
- Proof of Germany language skills of level A2/B1 according to the European Framework for Languages is mandatory

Please ensure that your application documents are complete. Incomplete applications may result in rejection of the visa application.
